SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS


To keep everyone safe, especially the most vulnerable among us, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- All in-person services require masks & social distancing. If you are not feeling well or have been recently exposed to COVID, please stay home & attend the Virtual Service.

- Pastor will stay behind the altar & pulpit other than to distribute Communion. In order to facilitate communication, he will not wear a mask when leading the liturgy or preaching, but will wear a mask to distribute Communion.
- Communion will be brought to you. Further instructions will be given at that time. If you do not want to receive Communion, that is ok.
- Worshipping together in-person, and especially indoors, carries the risk of transmitting COVID. Please only attend worship today if you feel comfortable taking that level of risk.

SCRIPTURE READING

1 Kings 17:1-16

17 Now Elijah the Tishbite, of Tishbe in Gilead, said to Ahab, "As the Lord the God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, there shall be neither dew nor rain these years, except by my word." ²The word of the Lord came to him, saying, ³"Go from here and turn eastward, and hide yourself by the Wadi Cherith, which is east of the Jordan. ⁴You shall drink from the wadi, and I have commanded the ravens to feed you

there.”⁵ So he went and did according to the word of the Lord; he went and lived by the Wadi Cherith, which is east of the Jordan. ⁶The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning, and bread and meat in the evening; and he drank from the wadi. ⁷But after a while the wadi dried up, because there was no rain in the land.

⁸Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, ⁹“Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you.” ¹⁰So he set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, “Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink.” ¹¹As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, “Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand.” ¹²But she said, “As the Lord your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die.” ¹³Elijah said to her, “Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son. ¹⁴For thus says the Lord the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the Lord sends rain on the earth.” ¹⁵She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days. ¹⁶The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Pastor: These are the gifts of God for you, the people of God. All of you here today are welcome to receive God's grace. Taste and see that the Lord is good. (Psalm 34:8)

DISTRIBUTION

Instructions: Remain where you are & please keep your mask on. The elements of Holy Communion will be brought to you. For safety reasons, we are currently using pre-packaged elements for Communion.

- *When the pastor comes to your area, extend your arms and cup your hands. The elements will be dropped into your hands.*
- *The package has 2 openings to peel back. Peeling the bottom cover releases the bread, and the top seal opens the wine. If you would prefer a grape juice or gluten-free option, please just let the pastor know either before worship or as you receive it.*

- *You may briefly remove your mask to eat & drink. Please put your mask back on immediately after finished.*
- *You can throw your cup away after worship is finished.*

If you do not wish to receive the Sacrament, simply cross your arms when the pastor comes near.

HUMAN NEEDS MINISTRY OF THE MONTH

This month we are supporting the food pantry at Dear Neighbor Ministries. Dear Neighbor Ministries is located in the Hilltop



neighborhood of Wichita and helps serve vulnerable populations in that area. They provide emergency and outreach assistance, a community food pantry, income tax assistance,

representative payee services, a community garden, and a peace garden. They are a ministry created and sponsored by the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, and we've had several Christ Lutheran members volunteer for them throughout the years. For their food pantry, we are collecting: Ramen noodles, canned pork & beans, canned fruit, canned chicken or tuna, canned vegetables, canned soup, peanut butter and jelly, spaghetti sauce, shelf stable milk, toilet paper, shampoo, razors, toothpaste, tooth brushes, bath soap, laundry soap, dish soap and cleaning supplies. You can place these supplies in the bin near our front door.

ANNUAL MEETING – November 22

Christ Lutheran's Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 22 at 4:00pm. Due to the pandemic, we are taking the extraordinary step of hosting our annual meeting online via Zoom. Hard copies of the 2020 Annual Report will soon be available at the church welcome table. Each CLC member will soon be receiving:

- *Via email:* a link to the Zoom meeting and CLC's 2020 Annual Report in electronic format. This will have reports from staff & council members, the agenda for the annual meeting, and our proposed budget for 2021. Please contact the office if you need help accessing Zoom.
- *Via mail:* A paper ballot for the selection of new council members and other positions. If you would like to vote for these positions secretly, simply mark your ballot and return it to the church by November 22. While voting for these positions is rarely contested (this year there is only 1 nominee per open position), returning the paper ballot does ensure that you can vote secretly or add a write-in candidate. A vote for each position will be taken during the Zoom meeting, but these "Zoom votes" will be impossible to be kept secret. The paper ballots that are returned will be counted alongside the votes that happen on Zoom.
