Our theme this year is "The Way of the Cross". Each Wednesday during Lent, we will have a meal that starts at 6:15pm and a short worship service that starts at 7:00. For worship we'll be using a liturgy called "Prayer Around the Cross" and they will have a very different feel than our normal Sunday worship services – quieter, darker, acoustic, more contemplative – as we

explore deep questions surrounding the cross like: Why did Jesus have to die on a cross? How does the cross save us? What does the cross mean for us today and how can we follow Jesus in the way of the cross?

If you were not here on Ash Wednesday, you can now pick up two gifts: a devotional to use throughout Lent and a cross for you to carry with you.

CREATION planting pollinator flowers and plants. Anyone is welcome to come! We chose Creation Care Team as the name for this new group.



<u>JUSTICE TOGETHER MEETING – THIS WEEK!</u>

We are having a short 45-minute Justice Together meeting this **Wednesday**,



March 6, after our Lenten worship service. Exciting things have been happening with our justice ministry across the city, especially with our Research Teams. They have been meeting with officials, groups, advocates,

organizations, and experts about the two issues that we voted on as our biggest justice concerns: homelessness & mental illness. At this meeting on Wednesday, we will get some important updates about what the Research Teams have discovered, how they are narrowing down & defining the specific problems we need to address, and get some previews as to the solutions that we will be proposing to our city/county leaders at our Nehemiah Action on Thursday, May 9th. Whether or not you've been involved with our justice ministry to this point, you are encouraged to hang around after worship on Wednesday and hear these important updates!

ATONEMENT THEORIES?

Have you ever heard of these before? Do you know what atonement is? (Answer: it is *how* God saves us and puts our brokenness back together again, making us *at one* with God again.) On Wednesday evenings,

Pastor Chad is going through different atonement theories that the Church has developed through the centuries and asking important questions of them, like "What does this say about the nature of God?", "What is this saying about how we should live as Christians?", and "What are some strengths & weaknesses of each theory?" So



far, we have covered Ransom Theory, Satisfaction Theory, and Penal Substitution Theory. It sounds all complicated & theological, but he's trying to break it down and even the kids are getting good stuff out of it. We'll learn about a couple more theories this week! Join us on Wednesday for the meal at 6:15, and the worship service at 7:00pm.




