In honor of Mother's Day, the human needs collection for May will be for baby care kits for Lutheran World Relief. These kits go to families in need around the world. For example: according to LWR, our faithful quilters and kit makers have comforted thousands of

people with their handmade gifts due to the war in the Ukraine. These have been distributed far and wide, from hostels for refugees in Poland to heavily shelled villages near the Russian border.

- 63,340 Personal Care Kits
 - 60,492 Mission Quilts
 - 10,960 School Kits
 - 6,720 Baby Care Kits

We saved some of the extra donated items from last year so were able to trim the list of requested items for the baby care kits. Noisy offering donations are appreciated to help buy the warm blankets I found on Amazon. I will put an example of a kit on the human needs table with one of these blankets.

Like Nehemiah, we will join our voices to present our local leaders with well-researched solutions to the root causes of these community problems. Christ Lutheran's goal is to get 100 people to the Nehemiah Assembly on May 9th. We hope you'll be part of this effort!

MENTAL HEALTH

People experiencing mental health issues in Sedgwick County are often unable to access timely and appropriate crisis care and often end up in Emergency rooms, or interacting with the criminal justice system which is costly and robs them of the opportunity to receive the support they need to lead productive and positive lives.

HOMELESSNESS

When we fail to provide adequate housing and supports, unhoused people are unable to exit homelessness into safe, stable housing and those experiencing poverty are more likely to undergo evictions and unstable housing situations. Further, people experincing housing insecurity and homelessness are often lacking photo identification, which are essential to securing critical services and basic necessities, i.e. benefits, assistance, library cards, and employment.
