

EASTER TRADITIONS

This year, we will continue some important Easter Traditions here at Christ Lutheran, including:

Flowering the Cross – Each person/family is invited to bring fresh cut flowers from home to decorate the cross in the



sanctuary. On Good Friday, we will each hammer a nail into the cross, and then on Easter Sunday, those same nails are used to hold the flowers, symbolizing the new life that Jesus gives us at his resurrection. Don't worry if you forget to bring flowers, we'll have plenty extra on hand, just in case.

Easter Egg Hunt – This event for the children will begin in the sanctuary at 10:15am. Each child who comes will be able to fill their baskets full of candy-stuffed eggs to

celebrate.

Sweetbreads & Cinnamon Rolls – While we don't do a big Easter brunch, we do invite folks to bring extra goodies, sweet breads, cinnamon rolls, juice, or


thankful that we have such a strong tradition here at Christ Lutheran! They are some of my favorite times of the year.

The Wood Between the Worlds by Brian Zahnd is a



recently published book with the subtitle, "a poetic theology of cross." This is a beautiful book that comes at meaning of the cross using ancient and contemporary images, movies, artwork and symbols. It is available on Amazon.

PASTOR'S EMERGENCY FUND

Christ Lutheran has a little Pastor's Emergency Fund set up so



that Pastor Chad can help people who call or come up to church looking for assistance. He uses these funds to purchase things like gas cards, Walmart gift cards, and motel rooms. Recently, he has been helping people with utility bills and motel rooms. This fund is getting a little bit low and

JUSTICE TOGETHER – SOLUTIONS RALLY!



Our next big justice event will be held on **Thursday, April 11th at 6:00pm.** It will be held at First United Methodist Church (339 N. Broadway). This will be a countywide gathering of all the congregations & participants, where we will hear a report from the Research Teams and a detailed plan for the solutions that we will be seeking. Our very own bishop, Bishop Susan Candea, of the Central States Synod, will be one of the featured speakers. The Research Teams (including Alan Wondra) have been hard at work since November identifying the underlying problems with mental illness & homelessness in our community, and they have come up with some strong, winnable, justice-oriented solutions. This is what we'll hear about on April 11th.

Our even bigger & more important Nehemiah Assembly will take place on Thursday, May 9th. Even if you can't make it to April's Solutions Rally, please plan to attend the Nehemiah Assembly on May 9th. That is the event where we need as many people as possible to show up. You can work for justice simply by being present and gathering with the other thousands of people of faith in our community working for justice. The more people we have attend, the bigger impact it will make!

JUSTICE FOR MENTAL HEALTH

And for just a little foretaste, the Mental Health Committee identified three problems they feel we need to address. Here is their <u>**Problems Statement**</u>:

- Gaps in Mobile Crisis Care Integrated Care Teams (ICTs) and Mobile Care Units (MCUs) from COMCARE are joint social work-law enforcement (or social work alone) teams that respond to individuals in crisis with a focus on treatment. ICTs & MCUs have proven to save money, give patients care on site, and provide a safe response compared to conventional law enforcement alone. However, ICTs are not available 24 hours/day, seven days/week in Sedgwick County/Wichita area.
- Gaps in Psychiatric Care at COMCARE Crisis Center Clients in crisis taken to the COMCARE Crisis Center by ICTs & MCUs are unable to get psychiatric treatment 24 hours/day, seven days/week leaving them untreated and destabilized particularly on the weekends.
- Inadequate Transportation for People with Mental Illness For those in treatment for mental illness in Sedgwick County, transportation creates a major barrier toward recovery. There is a program that was evaluated after one year, cost approximately \$900/month, provided free transportation to 15 people who met certain criteria (e.g. had a caseworker, desire to get treatment, etc.), and proved to be very successful.

To address these justice issues, here is the <u>Solutions Statement</u> that the Mental Health Committee will be presenting & working towards: We seek a full commitment to access to mental health care and substance

- use disorder treatment in Sedgwick County, particularly for its most vulnerable residents, through:
- Swift and fully resourced implementation for the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) model for COMCARE Community Crisis, including the staffing and facilities necessary for effective delivery of service, in order to increase access to care in the community.
- Continued implementation of a system of mental health crisis care that allows any Sedgwick County resident immediate access to appropriate care, allowing for diversion from emergency rooms and jail.
- Further support and coordination of transportation for those experiencing mental health issues, substance abuse and/or homelessness in order to increase their ability to follow through on their treatment and recovery plan.

JUSTICE FOR HOMELESSNESS

The Homelessness Committee identified 2 priority problems to address related to homelessness in Wichita. Here is their **<u>Problems Statement</u>**:

- Lack of Affordable Housing for the Homeless There is a lack of a comprehensive affordable housing plan with sustainable funding for those who are homeless in our community. When we fail to provide Affordable Housing for those experiencing homelessness or support for people at risk of homelessness, severely cost burdened households in poverty are more likely to experience unstable housing situations like evictions and people are unable to exit homelessness into safe, stable housing.
- Lack of Identification Unhoused people who do not have IDs are unable to retrieve documentation required for access to critical services and basic necessities, i.e. benefits, assistance, library cards, and employment.

To address these justice issues, here is the **Solutions Statement** that the Homelessness Committee will be presenting & working towards:

Solution for the Lack of Affordable Housing for the Homeless:

• To achieve Functional Zero in our community and provide people the dignity that they deserve, we support the utilization of a Housing First approach to ensure people experiencing homelessness have housing and wraparound supportive services to remove barriers to permanent housing, by advocating for fully funded operations of the Multi Agency Center with on campus housing.

Solution to the Lack of Identification:

• We recognize the sacred worth of all people and seek to provide dignity to our neighbors who are unhoused by providing access to photo identification through a Photo ID program in the Sedgwick County area to increase access to local services, employment, transportation, housing opportunities, and other services that improve quality of life.

A Note from the Millers:

This evening we took down all the get well cards, Christmas cards, notes of encouragement, cards and letters that have helped sustain us during this part of our journey at On With Life. They represent hundreds, perhaps thousands of prayers offered on behalf of ourselves and our entire family – both immediate & extended. Care here has been truly outstanding and will be missed. We will also miss the many therapists that worked with us on this part of our



journey, and on preparing us for the next part of our journey as we transition home. We especially



hold dear in our hearts all the cards and prayers from our church family at Christ Lutheran. We also look forward to returning to church on Easter Sunday, after having been gone for almost 5 ¹/₂ months. God's blessings to all who have been on this journey with us. **God is good!!!**
