

2024 NEHEMIAH ASSEMBLY

Justice Together is answering the call to do justice in Sedgwick County and we need your help! We are calling for broad-scale improvements to local systems alongside and on behalf of our neighbors experiencing *mental health crises* and/or *homelessness*. One person can't change a system. One faith community can't change a system. But when 35+ faith communities work together for justice, we'll have a voice so big it can't be ignored.

Like Nehemiah, we will join our voices to present our local leaders with well-researched solutions to the root causes of these community problems. Christ Lutheran's goal is to get 100 people to the Nehemiah Assembly on May 9th. We hope you'll be part of this effort!

Please check out the "You're Invited: 2024 Nehemiah Reference Guide" located at the Opportunity Table. In that pamphlet, you can read about the justice process, the countless hours of research & work that have been done over the past 18 months, and the specific solutions that we will be asking our community leaders to implement on May 9th. Christ Lutheran has always done good mercy ministry through things like St. Paul's Breakfast & Sandwich Saturday. 

Thank you to everyone who helped with our Heights' lunch/snack program this past year. We just have a




NEW MEN'S BIBLE STUDY FORMING!

MENTAL HEALTH

People experiencing mental health issues in Sedgwick County are often unable to access timely and appropriate crisis care and often end up in Emergency rooms, or interacting with the criminal justice system which is costly and robs them of the opportunity to receive the support they need to lead productive and positive lives.

HOMELESSNESS

When we fail to provide adequate housing and supports, unhoused people are unable to exit homelessness into safe, stable housing and those experiencing poverty are more likely to undergo evictions and unstable housing situations. Further, people experincing housing insecurity and homelessness are often lacking photo identification, which are essential to securing critical services and basic necessities, i.e. benefits, assistance, library cards, and employment.

IT'S TIME WE ACT FOR CHANGE.





We will talk with one another about:

- Why is talking about sexuality and gender identity in the church so difficult? And why do we need to keep talking about it?
- What are the premises for our various understandings - a lifestyle choice or part of God's created diversity?
- How do we interpret Scripture as both law and gospel?
- Why isn't saying, "All are Welcome" enough?
 Why do we have to be explicit and name various groups?
- What does it mean to be a Reconciling in Christ Synod? How does that designation impact our congregations?
- How do we travel together with Jesus in ways that do not exclude those who hold differing views?

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) Baby Kits

In honor of Mother's Day, the human needs collection for May will be for



baby care kits for Lutheran World Relief. These kits go to families in need around the world. For example: according to LWR, our faithful quilters and kit makers have comforted thousands of people with their handmade gifts due to the war in the Ukraine. These have been distributed far and wide, from

hostels for refugees in Poland to heavily shelled villages near the Russian border.

- 63,340 Personal Care Kits
 - 60,492 Mission Quilts
 - 10,960 School Kits
 - 6,720 Baby Care Kits

We saved some of the extra donated items from last year so were able to trim the list of requested items for the baby care kits. Noisy offering donations are appreciated to help buy the warm blankets I found on Amazon. I will put an example of a kit on the human needs table with one of these blankets.
