

Presiding Bishop Elizabeth A. Eaton will join congregations in Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma, Nebraska and Texas on July 31 at 7 p.m. Central time for a regional conversation on <u>God's Love Made Real</u>. The Rev. Susan Candea, bishop of the ELCA Central States Synod, will host the online conversation.

God's Love Made Real is a movement encouraging the ELCA to create a world experiencing the difference God's grace and love in Christ make for all people and creation.

During this discussion the presiding bishop will share why God's Love Made Real is meaningful to her and the future of the church. Participants will have the opportunity to share experiences and ask questions.

"The Spirit is calling us to move together as one church to share the grace and love we experience every day," said Eaton.

Whether you are active in a congregation, are a pastor in the ELCA or haven't been to church in months, your voice is valuable. This conversation seeks to activate **every one of us** so that more people might know the way of Jesus and discover community, justice and love.

New Summer Series on the Way...

Next week we are beginning a new summer series on the book of First Corinthians. This is an interesting, complex book of the Bible that addresses



a messy, complicated congregation in the city of Corinth. Paul writes to them to help solve some of their problems (notably, quarreling with and disrespecting each other). Time and time again



Paul calls them to value each other and build up the body of Christ. In chapter 3, verse 10, he even talks about being a "master builder" himself (maybe this is where Legos got their idea from?). Paul consistently calls them to remember Jesus Christ crucified and build on the foundation of the cross that he laid down.

Starting Jand for the remaining weeks of the summer, we will be hitting some of the highlights of First Corinthians, maybe playing with some Legos, and hopefully learning how to become *Master Builders for Jesus* and build every day for the Kingdom of God.



Justice Together Update:

Justice Together had a magnificent turn out at our May Nehemiah Assembly. Over 1,300 people attended and saw the Local Officials and State Official agree with

our findings in the areas of mental health and the homeless. The Officials agreed to work and get the 5 findings we proposed addressed. We are now meeting with them monthly to get updates and help push the 5 findings to completion. In just the first month, significant progress has been seen. We will keep you all posted. As with any nonprofit, funding is needed to help pay the expenses of the nonprofit to keep it moving forward. The work of the nonprofit cannot be done without financial support. In June we kicked off the fund-raising drive to help meet the needs of our expenses for this next year. During our Investment Drive, Justice Together is raising funds using three different methods.

- First method is Congregational Investments. Each congregation that has signed the charter is being asked to invest in the nonprofit. Christ Lutheran voted and agreed to invest \$6,000 in 2024. These funds are coming from our Designated Fund Development Account.
- The 2nd method of raising funds is our Corporate Investment drive. The Corporate Investment drive is going on right now. The maximum we will have any one company invest in Justice Together is \$10,000. These investments are capped at \$10,000 so no one company can make a large investment and then influence the work being done by the nonprofit.
- 3rd method of raising funds is from you, our congregational members. Christ Lutheran had over 65 individuals representing our congregation at the Nehemiah Assembly. As you will remember from the listening sessions last fall, we asked each participant to become a congregation member of Justice Together. Justice Together is now asking for individual congregation member investments in the nonprofit. Justice Together is asking for a \$200 investment from each of our congregation members. This includes all of you who have participated in the work this last year and any

congregation member who would like to simply support Justice Togethers mission financially. Payment can be made in total or made in increments. Less than \$17 a month would meet the \$200 threshold. If \$200 cannot be given, please give what you can. Every dollar helps. Checks can be made out to Justice Together and collected by our tellers on Sunday's, and I will take them to the Justice Together office. If you'd prefer to make the check out to Christ Lutheran, you will need to document in the memo section of your check that it is being given for Justice Together. 

SOME OUTDOOR UPDATES

There's been some recent updates & improvements to our property recently. You may notice a whole plethora of beautiful flowers around our building in the front, back, and even way back by the prayer labyrinth. These flowers have all been planted by our Creation Care Team, led by Rosie Harder, and are meant to serve & provide sanctuary for all the pollinators in nature – the bees, bugs, butterflies, and even hummingbirds. They also provide a lot of beauty for us to enjoy.

And maybe not quite as beautiful, you'll notice a large shipping container now resting where the old white shed used to be. This is a project still in the works, but it was started a couple months ago. Our old shed was having lots of problems, including being very attractive to students skipping class and hiding from



administrators. Because the shed wasn't doing a lot for us anyways, the Property Team & Council decided to replace it with a more secure and less-attractive-to-students shipping container. The new container will be able store everything we need, including our mower, and should be much more secure. A very special thanks to Paul & Kenny Shaw who have systematically dismantled the old shed to make way for the new container. And less you fear, there are plans to paint the container and make it look good as new, but we must wait for the proper weather to do that.

July Human Needs Collection:

Lutheran World Relief: School Kits



Thanks to everyone who contributes to noisy offering and the table collections for human needs! Rich & I delivered some of the diapers from the June collection and a new baby crib donated by Connie Schlatter to the IRC. The warehouse was about 1/2 full and we learned of some of their current needs.

The July/August collection for human needs will be for Lutheran World Relief for school kits. Today, I watched a I minute video from Lutheran World Relief. A shipment is currently on the way from the Minnesota warehouse (where our contributions go) to Lebanon. It is to provide hope, support, and comfort to people who are seeking refuge from the ongoing conflict in Israel and Gaza. The shipment includes school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits, and 18,000 quilts. Thanks to everyone at CLC who donates to human needs so we can be a part of this!



Creation Care Update:

We finished planting milkweed and black eyed susans. Now, we will be weeding and watering as needed. Please let me know if you are willing to help with weeding and watering. I would like to point out which plants are the native Kansas plants as they may be unfamiliar to you

and look like a weed. The native plants are perennials and should come up on their own next spring. These are plants that will tolerate the heat and wind in July & August and bloom and produce pollen then.

I was concerned that the native plants did not seem to be thriving so I obtained soil samples and took them to the Sedgwick County extension office. The sample will be sent to K-State and results will be available in about 6 weeks with recommendations. The soil close to the church has a lot of clay and rocks. Though we removed some of the clay and added garden topsoil, sand, and composted manure, it may need additional work. I also was able to talk to a master gardener and she told me that the native plants might be putting down deep roots now. She recommended wildflowers to aid in assisting butterflies. **-Rosie**
